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# **1. EUPHA conference Montreux: looking back**

The 14<sup>th</sup> annual EUPHA conference was organised from 16 to 18 November in Montreux, Switzerland. The main theme of the conference was "Politics, policies and/or the public's health". More than 1300 public health experts from over 60 countries participated in this conference. For the Montreux conference, we received a total of 604 single abstracts and 49 workshop proposals from 50 countries. All abstracts and workshops were peer-reviewed by our International Scientific Committee, lead this year by Prof. Charlotte Braun-Fahrlander. The International Scientific Committee consisted of 38 members from 29 European countries. The members of the scientific committee have used a rating scale ranging from 1 to 5 for the final judgement. The overall average of all judges and all (single) abstracts was 3.20. The average judgement per abstract varied from 4.250 (highest score) to 1.778 (lowest score). The overall average of all judges for the workshops was 3.320. The average judgement per workshop varied from 4.600 (highest score) to 1.400 (lowest score). EUPHA would like to thank the members of the International Scientific Committee for their expertise and commitment to ensure the scientific quality of each EUPHA conference.

The EUPHA conference in Montreux introduced a number of innovations to our conferences:

- Due to the large interest in participation in the Montreux conference, 11 parallel sessions took place at six slots in the programme, totalling the number of oral sessions to a maximum of 66.
- More than 250 posters were presented at the Montreux conference.
- A new record in pre-conference activities was reached. Furthermore, a number of sideconference activities were also organised.
- Following the positive experience of the Graz conference, the Montreux conference also organised the oral and poster presentations in tracks, making it easier to follow a specific subject throughout the conference.

A conference proceedings report in which the major outcomes are made available to a wider audience is to be published the beginning of 2007.

The best poster prize was voted by the participants and was awarded to Dr Gabriele Messina and his team of the University of Siena, Department of Public Health, Laboratory of Health Services Research, Siena, Italy for his poster: "Measure your health!".

The best abstract prize went to Hélène Chevrou-Séverac and her colleagues of the Institute of Health Economics and Management, University of Lausanne, Switzerland for their abstract: "Out-of-pocket payments and financial burdenof elderly with depressive symptoms across Europe". Both prizes consist of a waiver of conference fees for the year after.
