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1. EUPHA update

Agreement reached on European Data Protection Regulation

Agreement was reached between the European Parliament, the Council of Ministers, and the European Commission on the Data Protection Regulation (and associated law enforcement Directive) on 15 December 2015. The results look good for future health research and the prospects for building databases for research purposes.

Earlier in the negotiations, EUPHA and many members have expressed their concern about the anticipated threats to research given the strict definitions in earlier versions of the Regulation. We thank you for your support in raising your voice and making this happen.

The final debate focused on requirements for pseudonymised entries in databases (advised but not mandatory in all situations), and on derogations from the rights of individuals to have access to stored information and the right of correction and deletion from databases. The outcome makes it possible to preserve and use data for important health and other research purposes The full text is available here: http://www.statewatch.org/news/2015/dec/eu-council-dp-reg-draft-final-compromise-15039-15.pdf The most important text to read is Article 83, but you may also want to take a look at Articles 4 - 9 and 14 - 19. Formal decisions by the European Parliament and the Council of Ministers are expected in early Spring 2016.

Theme of the 6th European Conference on Migrant and Ethnic Minority Health is '**Equity – the Policy Practice Gap**'. Plenary sessions and presentations will focus on socio-demographic and political determinants for health and the policy environment with relevance for migrants, ethnic minorities, asylum seekers, refugees, undocumented migrants. 2. European Public Health Conference

Vienna 2016: the place to be





The 9th European Public Health Conference will be held from 9 to 12 November at the ACV in Vienna, Austria. The theme for the 9th EPH Conference is 'All for Health, Health for All'. A healthy population is a key requirement for the achievement of society's goals. Good health for all enhances quality of life, improves workforce productivity, increases the capacity for learning, strengthens families and communities, supports sustainable habitats and environments, and contributes to security, poverty reduction and social inclusion. The relation between health, well-being and economic development has been propelled up the political agenda of all countries. Increasingly, communities, employers and industries are expecting and demanding strong coordinated government action to promote health in all sectors of society and avoid duplication and fragmentation of actions. Through the plenary sessions, this vision is further explored.

From Ottawa to Vienna: 30 years of the Ottawa Charter. In November 2016 we will celebrate the 30th anniversary of the Ottawa Charter, launched as a series of actions to achieve the goal of 'Health for All' through better health promotion. Where are we now and where should we go?

Health for All. In this plenary session we highlight the importance of good health and access to health care for all.

All for Health. The third plenary session looks outside the traditional fields of public health. Are other fields aware that their work has an impact on health?

Health Technologies. Health technologies, E-health, telemedicine, health apps, smart watches, ambient assisted technology and living. Where does that lead to?

Achieving health in fragmented systems. This session explores the relation between new forms of work, social solidarity, health insurance and health promotion.

A working group of SESPAS highlighted the risks of the TTIP through a statement which included the health, legal, economic and democracy related aspects, and calling citizens and political parties to position themselves against it. British lawmakers call for sugar tax to tackle childhood obesity

British lawmakers urged the government on Monday to introduce tough measures, including a tax on sugary drinks and controls on price promotions for "unhealthy food and drink," to help tackle childhood obesity. Parliament's Health Committee said there was "clear evidence that measures to improve the food environment" must be used to tackle obesity, treatment of which costs the state-run health service 5.1 billion pounds (\$7.6 billion) every year.
