#### Join the network meeting 2022:

The "Join the network" meeting during the World Public Health Congress 2021 was attended by 40+ participants. After introducing the steering committee, president Sonia Saxena was looking back on all the things the committee has achieved in 2022. Vice president Julia Dratva showed the attendees our plans for 2023 and we discussed what we would like to work on together in 2023. Different topics were mentioned:

- 1. Health promotion (literacy): identifying the youth's (and parents) needs and what they need to know/life skills
- 2. Digital Health Data
- 3. Health Systems: learning objectives at school/the curriculum does not include mental/fysical health
- 4. Chronic diseases
- 5. Health inequality

As the interest of young people is not reflected in (health) policy, the section should work on integrated health topics and addressing stakeholders on the right level. Minutes are on the website.

- Members were contacted and invited to participate workshops organized for EPH Conference 2022 and the Join the Network Meeting in Berlin.




# Activities at the EPH conference/ World Public Health Congress Nov 2022 Preconference activities
